COURSE: BIOL-315* Plants and Human Culture TERM: Winter 2026 Coordinator: TBD Lecturer: TBD

SUMMARY:

Humans interact with plants in a wide range of contexts daily. This course focuses on the biology of plants used for food, fiber, shelter and pleasure. We examine historical and contemporary human-plant interactions in the context of agriculture through the lens of evolutionary biology. Emphasis is placed on recognizing which plant parts are used by humans and converted to consumer products. Exam questions are short or long answers; exams are not T/F or multiple choice.

DUTIES:

TA duties in this course may include any of the following:

- 1. Grading exams in consultation with instructor.
- 2. Grading assignments (using providing guidelines or rubric) and providing meaningful feedback to students.
- 3. Facilitating student discussion / written reflection sessions.
